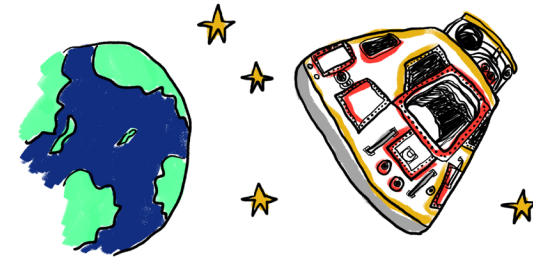

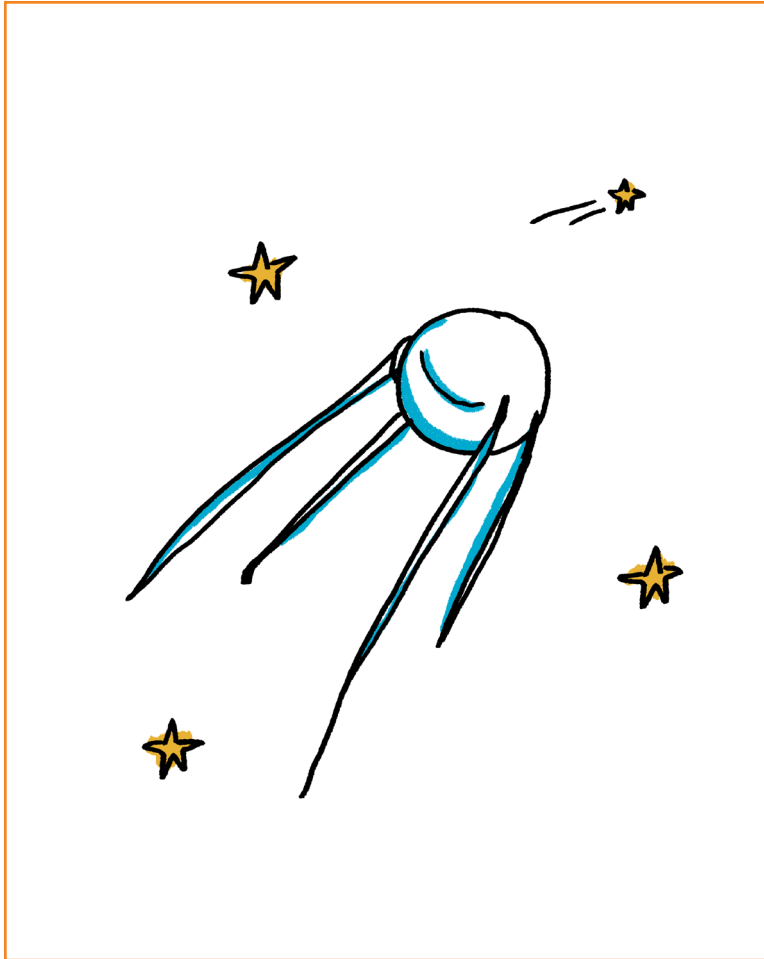

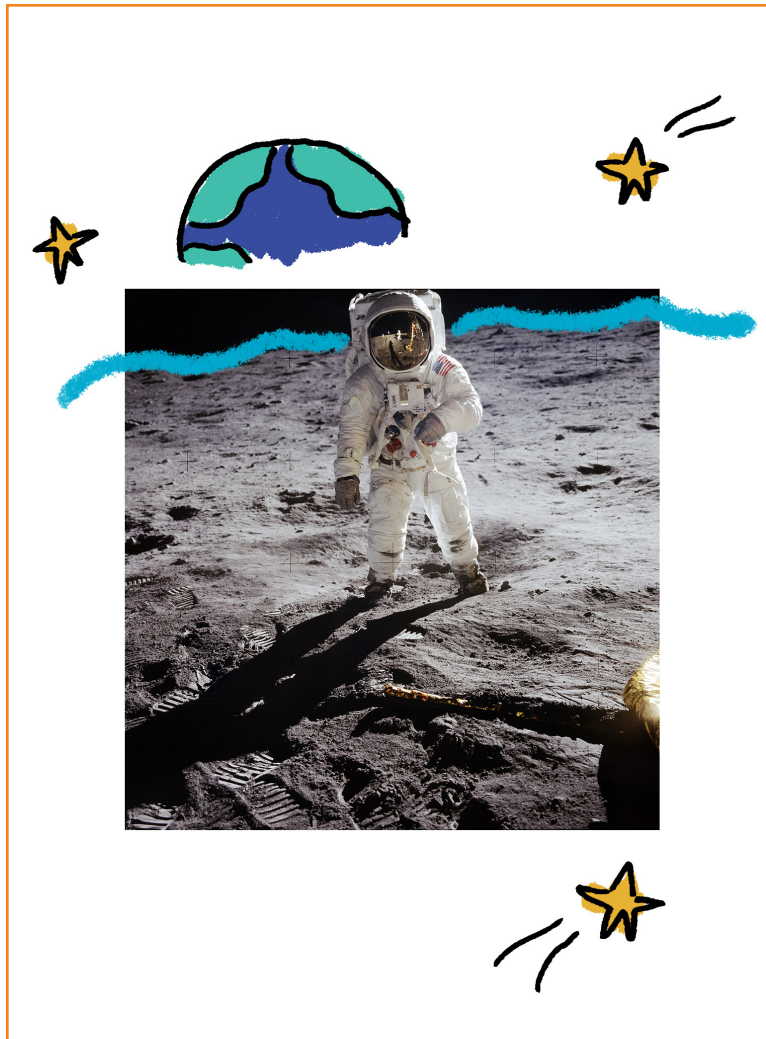

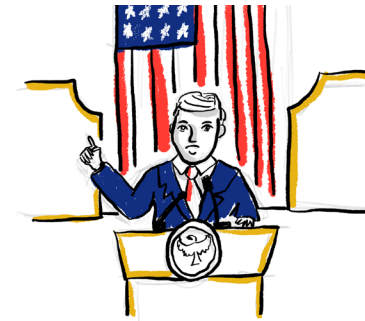

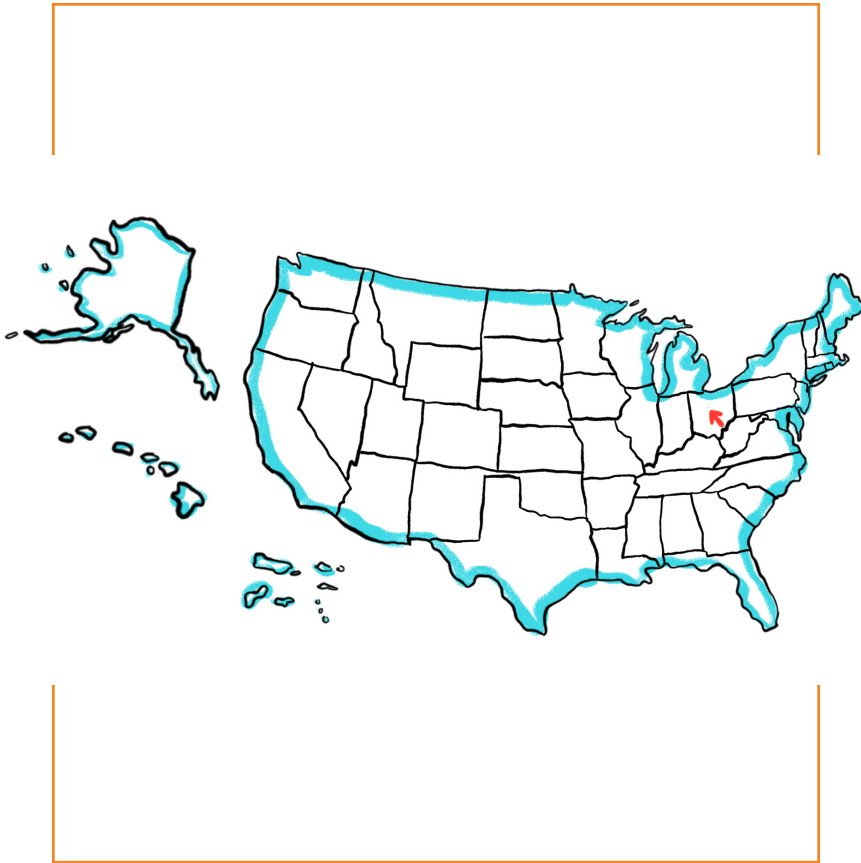

It was not easy. Alarms went off to warn of danger. Neil carefully landed the *Eagle* on the surface of the Moon. That took courage.



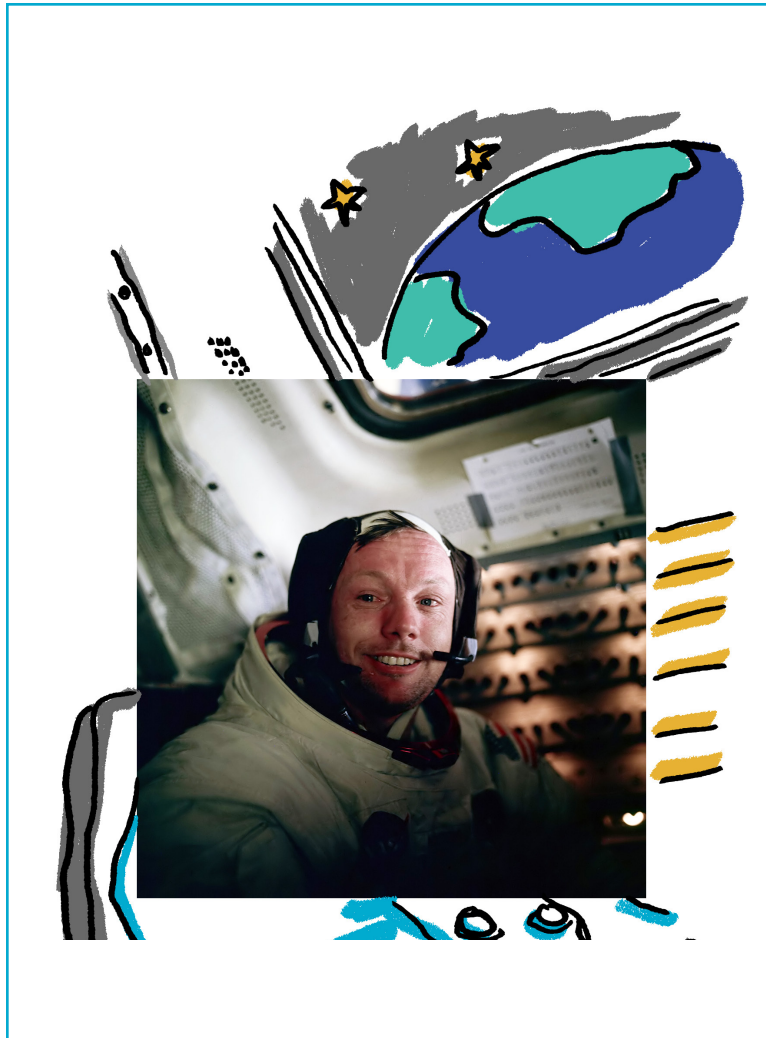

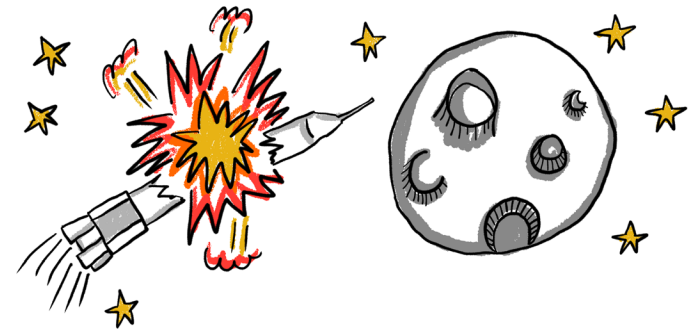

CHAPTER 2

Who was Neil Armstrong?

Neil Armstrong was chosen for this mission because he was brave and smart. He grew up in Ohio, loved flying, and became an engineer and a pilot. Later, he became an astronaut.

Courage is doing what is right or good even if it is hard or scary.

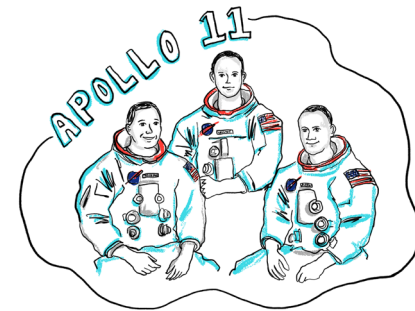
When we think of courage, we can think of a big and strong lion!

On July 16, 1969, Neil and two other astronauts, Buzz Aldrin and Michael Collins, climbed into their spaceship. The mission was called Apollo 11.

Millions of people watched on television as the giant rocket blasted off. It shook the ground and left a trail of fire as it soared into space. Neil felt heavy in his seat as the rocket sped fast into the air.
