Recommendations:

1. Cards are more sturdy when printed on cardstock.
2. Laminating cards will ensure they last longer and can be re-used in your class.

## FOR TEACHERS:

- The game is self-correcting — once students understand the pattern, they can play independently.
- The cards will always follow the same order each time the game is played.
- If any cards remain unread at the end of the game, this signals an incorrect answer was given during play.

## INSTRUCTIONS

### Setup:

- Distribute all cards evenly to the group. There are 18 cards total.
  - It's okay if some players have more cards than others.
- Ensure no cards are left over — all cards are needed to play.

### How to Play:

- Have players stand in a circle.
- One player will have the "I have START, Who has \_\_\_\_\_?" card.
- This player begins the game by reading their card aloud. The player whose card contains the answer to that question responds by reading their card aloud.
- Play continues in this way until a student reads the final card: "I have \_\_\_\_\_ and I have THE END."
- The game should end with no unread cards.
