# **DECONSTRUCTED DBQ GRAPHIC ORGANIZER**

#### **OBJECTIVE:**

I can group primary source documents to use on the deconstructed document-based question (DBQ).

#### **DIRECTIONS:**

#### **HEADS UP:**

When you group documents, you are looking for similarities between the document's content. These similarities could be about the creator of the document, the audience of the document, the purpose of the document, or the time the document was created. The similarities bring the documents together to help answer the prompt. Groups should be of at least two documents. We call this "Framing your thinking" because you collect your documents and connections in the picture frames.




